




















# Sakura Chapter Books 2007

	<p><b>Book 1</b>  <b>Allison, Jennifer. Gilda Joyce, psychic investigator.</b>          During the summer before ninth grade, intrepid Gilda Joyce invites herself to the San Francisco mansion of distant cousin Lester Splinter and his thirteen-year-old daughter, where she uses her purported psychic abilities and detective skills to solve the mystery of the mansion's boarded-up tower.</p>
	<p><b>Book 2</b>  <b>Balliett, Blue and Helquist, Brett. The Wright 3.</b>          In the midst of a series of unexplained accidents and mysterious coincidences, sixth-graders Calder, Petra, and Tommy lead their classmates in an attempt to keep Frank Lloyd Wright's famous Robie House from being demolished.</p>
	<p><b>Book 3</b>  <b>Birdsall, Jeanne. The Penderwicks : a summer tale of four sisters, two rabbits, and a very interesting boy.</b>          While vacationing with their widowed father in the Berkshire Mountains, four lovable sisters, ages four through twelve, share adventures with a local boy, much to the dismay of his snobbish mother.</p>
	<p><b>Book 4</b>  <b>Broach, Elise. Shakespeare's secret.</b>          Named after a character in a Shakespeare play, misfit sixth-grader Hero becomes interested in exploring this unusual connection because of a valuable diamond supposedly hidden in her new house, an intriguing neighbor, and the unexpected attention of the most popular boy in school.</p>
	<p><b>Book 5</b>  <b>Broome, Errol. Gracie and the emperor.</b>          Gracie, a poor eleven-year-old girl whose life begins to mysteriously change when Napoleon Bonaparte is exiled to her island, is shocked to learn that the fallen emperor--the monster in the frightening stories she has heard all her life--is her benefactor.</p>
	<p><b>Book 6</b>  <b>Buckley, Michael. The sisters Grimm, book one : fairy-tale detectives.</b>          Orphans Sabrina and Daphne Grimm are sent to live with an eccentric grandmother that they have always believed to be dead.</p>
	<p><b>Book 7</b>  <b>Burns, Laura and Metz, Melinda. The case of the prank that stank.</b>          When it comes to making friends, B. Orville Wright doesn't quite fit into the equation. That's why he's lucky to have Agatha Wong. Together they solve the hardest (and stinkiest) cases.</p>

	<p><b>Book 8</b>  <b>Child, Lauren. Clarice Bean spells trouble.</b>  Clarice Bean, aspiring actress and author, unsuccessfully tries to avoid getting into trouble as she attempts to help a friend in need by following the rules of the fictional, "exceptionordinarily" spy, Ruby Redfort.</p>
	<p><b>Book 9</b>  <b>Codell, Esmé Raji. Diary of a fairy godmother.</b>  Hunky Dory is an unconventional witch who would rather grant wishes than cast spells which gets her kicked out of charm school; so Hunky sets out to become the best fairy godmother she can be.</p>
	<p><b>Book 10</b>  <b>Creech, Sharon and Creech, Sharon. Replay : a new book.</b>  While preparing for a role in the school play, twelve-year-old Leo finds an autobiography that his father wrote as a teenager and ponders the ways people change. Includes the text for the play, "Rumpopo's Porch."</p>
	<p><b>Book 11</b>  <b>Cussler, Clive and Farnsworth, William. The adventures of Vin Fiz.</b>  Ten-year-old twins Casey and Lacey fly an enchanted, antique airplane, named the "Vin Fiz," across the United States and have several daring adventures along the way. Includes historical notes on the real "Vin Fiz," the name of the airplane that made the first transcontinental flight in 1911.</p>
	<p><b>Book 13</b>  <b>DiCamillo, Kate and Ibatouline, Bagram. The miraculous journey of Edward Tulane.</b>  Edward Tulane, a cold-hearted and proud toy rabbit, loves only himself until he is separated from the little girl who adores him and travels across the country, acquiring new owners and listening to their hopes, dreams, and histories</p>
	<p><b>Book 14</b>  <b>Greene, Stephanie. Queen Sophie Hartley.</b>  A suggestion from her mother leads Sophie to befriend the new girl at school and an elderly, grouchy woman, and helps her overcome the feeling that she is not good at anything.</p>
	<p><b>Book 15</b>  <b>Gutman, Dan. The homework machine.</b>  Four fifth-grade students--a geek, a class clown, a teacher's pet, and a slacker--as well as their teacher and mothers, each relate events surrounding a computer programmed to complete homework assignments.</p>

	<p><b>Book 16</b>  <b>Hiaasen, Carl. Flush.</b>  With their father jailed for sinking a river boat, Noah Underwood and his younger sister, Abbey, must gather evidence that the owner of this floating casino is emptying his bilge tanks into the protected waters around their Florida Keys home.</p>
	<p><b>Book 17</b>  <b>Holm, Jennifer L and Holm, Matthew. Babymouse.</b>  An imaginative mouse dreams of being queen of the world, but will settle for an invitation to the most popular girl's slumber party.</p>
	<p><b>Book 18</b>  <b>Levine, Gail Carson and Christiana, David. Fairy dust and the quest for the egg.</b>  Prilla, the unusual new fairy in Neverland, finds her mettle, Mother Dove's wisdom, and Tinker Bell's courage tested by many trials, including a hurricane, a selfish fairy, and Captain Hook.</p>
	<p><b>Book 19</b>  <b>McKay, Hilary. Permanent Rose.</b>  While trying to reconnect with her friend Tom, who has returned to the United States without leaving a forwarding address, eight-year-old Rose inadvertently discovers the identity of her adopted sister Saffy's father.</p>
	<p><b>Book 20</b>  <b>Morpurgo, Michael. The amazing story of Adolphus Tips.</b>  When Boowie reads the diary that his grandmother sends him, he learns of her childhood in World War II England when American and British soldiers practiced for D-Day's invasion in the area of her home, and about her beloved cat, Adolphus Tip, and the cat's namesake.</p>
	<p><b>Book 21</b>  <b>Pullman, Philip and Bailey, Peter. The scarecrow and his servant.</b>  A scarecrow and his boy servant, Jack, set off on a dangerous adventure as they try to outwit the crooked Buffaloni family and stake their claim to valuable Spring Valley.</p>
	<p><b>Book 23</b>  <b>Shipton, Paul. The Pig Scrolls.</b>  Gryllus, an ancient Greek hero has been turned into a pig by Circe and is content to stay that way until a prophetess, Sibyl, kidnaps him and informs him that he is the only one who can save the world.</p>

	<p><b>Book 24</b>  <b>Smith, Anne Warren. Tails of spring break.</b>  Katie endures a challenging spring break during which she is forced to share her bedroom with Claire, her difficult neighbor and classmate, and run a pet-sitting business at the same time.</p>
	<p><b>Book 25</b>  <b>Smith, Roland. Cryptid hunters.</b>  Twins, Grace and Marty, along with a mysterious uncle, are dropped into the middle of the Congolese jungle in search of their missing photojournalist parents.</p>
	<p><b>Book 27</b>  <b>Torrey, Michele. Voyage of plunder.</b>  Fourteen-year-old Daniel's life is turned upside down when his father's merchant ship is plundered by pirates in 1696 and Daniel is forced to stay aboard the pirate ship as a hostage.</p>
	<p><b>Book 28</b>  <b>Umansky, Kaye. The silver spoon of Solomon Snow.</b>  Ten-year-old Solomon Snow, a foundling who was discovered with a distinctive silver spoon in his mouth, sets out to find his parents and receives help along the way from an aspiring writer, a precocious young circus performer, and several orphans.</p>
	<p><b>Book 29</b>  <b>Whelan, Gloria. Chu Ju's house.</b>  In order to save her baby sister, fourteen-year-old Chu Ju leaves her rural home in modern China and earns food and shelter by working on a sampan, tending silk worms, and planting rice seedlings, while wondering if she will ever see her family again.</p>
